During the withdrawal of the 250 remaining troops, Durito informs El Sup that he will change his name from "Don Durito de la Lacandona" to "Durito-dot-com."

## Ladies and Gentlemen:

Here goes a communiqué on the recent troop withdrawal.

When the soldiers arrived, they did so furtively; now they are withdrawing with a great public show. If peace does, in fact, arrive, it does not matter to us that they present as Zapatistas those who are not (the ones from ARIC), and the ones
